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
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ABOUT US

INTRODUCTION

The Annual Report 2022–23 of Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation presents a structured account of the organization’s interventions, outcomes, and alignment with state and national priorities in the areas of women’s empowerment, rural livelihoods, and gobar-based environmental solutions. The reporting period reflects consolidation of gaumay (cow-based) value chains as a viable economic and ecological model in partnership with community institutions and Gaushalas.

During the year, the Foundation advanced the Gaumay Shilp initiative, providing structured skill development to over 400 rural women and enabling employment for 150 women through handicrafts and cow dung-based products. Parallely, the adoption of bovine strengthened integrated use of cow dung and related by-products for eco-friendly fuel, artisanal items, and agri-support inputs. Key interventions included supply of cow dung logs to cremation grounds and successful execution of an Eco-Friendly Holika Dahan Campaign using 100% cow dung-based structures.

As part of its eco-conscious and culturally rooted initiatives, Srishti Mangalam Gau Ashray prepared 500 Diwali gift packs made entirely from cow dung, formally presented to the Hon’ble Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Shri Yogi Adityanath Ji, by the Hon’ble Minister of Animal Husbandry, Shri Dharmpal Ji. The Chief Minister commended the model’s cultural relevance and employment potential within Gaushala-linked entrepreneurship.

The Foundation also introduced eco-friendly havan cups and incense sticks crafted from indigenous cow dung, now available at the Ram Janmabhoomi market in Ayodhya and in Vrindavan, thereby extending gobar-based products into organized devotional retail. A further milestone was the inauguration of the cow dung product initiative by the Hon’ble Chief Minister, reinforcing institutional confidence in the Foundation’s gobar-dhan and livelihood efforts.



Inauguration of Cow Dung Product Workshop by Hon'ble Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath Ji



Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Yogi Adityanath Ji inaugurated the Cow Dung Product Project, an eco-conscious initiative jointly undertaken by Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation and the Municipal Corporation's Gopal Gaushala. The project focuses on converting cow dung into sustainable and biodegradable products such as Ganpati idols, diyas, havan wood, and incense sticks, thereby promoting both environmental conservation and rural livelihood generation. It aims to reduce reliance on non-biodegradable materials while creating employment opportunities, especially for women and members of marginalized communities involved in the production process. On the occasion of the launch, a handcrafted Ganpati idol made from cow dung was respectfully presented to Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri Yogi Adityanath Ji and BJP State President Shri Bhupendra Singh Ji. The event was marked by the presence of several dignitaries, including Shri Bhupendra Singh Chaudhary, Shri Dharmpal Singh, Shri Vinod Agarwal, Shri Ritesh Gupta, Smt. Priya Agarwal, Shri Dharmendra Mishra, Shri Shailendra Kumar, Shri Sanjay Chauhan, Shri Anil, and Smt. Deepshikha, all of whom extended their encouragement and support to this innovative and culturally rooted initiative.

Natural Paint Made from Cow Dung



Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation marked a significant milestone in its sustainability mission by introducing the first-ever natural paint made from cow dung, under the banner of **#VocalForLocal**. This pioneering innovation serves as an eco-friendly alternative to conventional chemical-based paints, aiming to reduce environmental toxicity while promoting safer indoor air quality. The paint is not only biodegradable and non-toxic but also supports traditional knowledge systems and rural craftsmanship. Through this initiative, the Foundation reaffirmed its commitment to environmental preservation and rural empowerment, encouraging the use of indigenous resources and generating livelihood opportunities within local communities. This development further strengthens the organization's focus on promoting sustainable, culturally rooted alternatives in everyday living.

Eco-Friendly Holika Dahan Campaign by Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation Concludes Successfully



Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation successfully concluded its Eco-Friendly Holika Dahan campaign across Moradabad, promoting the use of cow dung logs as a sustainable alternative to traditional wood for Holika bonfires. The campaign was formally inaugurated at Kaleshwar Dham Temple, New Moradabad, in the presence of esteemed dignitaries including District Magistrate Mr. Shailendra Kumar Singh, Mayor Mr. Vinod Agarwal, ADM Mr. Alok Verma, Superintendent Mr. Viresh Sharma, Jailer Mr. Mrityunjay Pandey, and State Vice President of Mahila Morcha Mrs. Priya Agarwal. Cow dung wood for the celebrations was sourced from gaushalas housing aged, non-milking cows, which not only ensured environmental responsibility but also provided employment to caretakers and contributed to the economic sustainability of the shelters. These Eco-friendly Holika Dahan ceremonies were conducted in over 50 locations across the city, including Lajpat Nagar, Adarsh Nagar, Prabhat Market, Manpur, Kothiwal Nagar, Imperial, Kanjari Sarai, Sagar Sarai, Ram Ganga Vihar, Anand Vihar, New Moradabad, Naveen Nagar, Civil Lines, Jigar Colony Linepar, Khushal Nagar, Gandhi Nagar, Mansarovar, and Buddhi Vihar.

Dignified Cremation of Unclaimed and Destitute Individuals



This was one of the significant steps we took towards ensuring dignity in death for the unclaimed and underprivileged individuals in Moradabad through an important meeting held in the presence of ADM City Shri Alok Verma and SP City Shri Akhilesh Badodiya, along with all key stakeholders involved in the respectful cremation of destitute persons. It was collectively decided that Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation would provide Gaucast (cow dung-based eco-logs) free of cost at five major cremation grounds across Moradabad for the cremation of unclaimed bodies and those whose families are financially incapable of performing the last rites. This initiative also locked in to promote the use of eco-friendly alternatives over traditional wood, contributing to both social welfare and environmental sustainability. Local authorities welcomed the decision, recognizing it as a compassionate and necessary measure to uphold human dignity. The initiative was driven by the Foundation's commitment to ensure that even the most forgotten individuals are laid to rest with dignity and respect.

Workshop Organized at Srishti Mangalam Gau Ashray



A special workshop was organized at Srishti Mangalam Gau Ashray, where devotees were introduced to the traditional practice of crafting sacred deity idols from cow dung. This initiative was part of Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation's ongoing efforts to revive and sustain environmentally conscious, heritage-based practices that honor India's deep-rooted cultural traditions; and with it opening up avenues for livelihood generation. Participants were taught the step-by-step process of preparing and shaping cow dung into spiritually significant forms, combining ecological responsibility with religious devotion. The workshop not only served as a platform for hands-on learning but also emphasized the role of cow-based natural materials in reducing dependence on harmful, commercially produced items. The event encouraged self-reliance, inspired creativity, and reinforced the values of sustainability, reverence for nature, and cultural continuity among the attendees.

By introducing these products at two of the most revered spiritual destinations, the foundation aimed to integrate cow dung items into mainstream religious rituals and public awareness. The effort not only celebrated India’s cultural heritage but also advanced the cause of environmental sustainability and self-reliant Gaushala operations.

50+ women employed in Moradabad & Meerut district jails on a seasonal basis to crochet handmade mufflers, caps, socks, etc



Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation engaged over 50 women inmates from the Moradabad and Meerut district jails in a seasonal livelihood initiative focused on crocheting handmade woollen products such as mufflers, caps, and socks.

The initiative provided skill-based employment within correctional settings, enabling participants to earn with dignity while developing craft skills. Seasonal engagement offered flexibility and consistent income during peak production periods.

Beyond livelihood generation, the programme fostered confidence, discipline, and purpose, supporting the broader goal of rehabilitation and social reintegration.

Free Sanitary pads distributed in Moradabad & Meerut district Jails - 1,500 packs



Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation distributed 1,500 packs of sanitary pads free of cost to women inmates across the Moradabad and Meerut district jails, as part of its continued commitment to menstrual equity and dignity.

The initiative aimed to address the lack of access to safe menstrual hygiene products within correctional settings, ensuring that women are able to manage their menstrual health with comfort, privacy, and respect. By providing regular and reliable access to sanitary pads, the Foundation sought to reduce health risks while fostering awareness around menstrual hygiene.

This intervention reflects Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation's belief that menstrual dignity is a fundamental right and an essential component of women's health and well-being, irrespective of circumstance.

INITIATIVES

Menstrual hygiene sessions conducted in 25 more villages & 15 schools



Throughout the year, Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation conducted menstrual hygiene awareness sessions across 25 villages and 15 schools, reaching adolescent girls and women with accurate information and practical guidance.

The sessions were co-ed and focused on building awareness around menstrual health, breaking stigma, promoting hygienic practices, and encouraging open conversations. Age-appropriate and culturally sensitive methods were used to ensure effective understanding and participation.

Through this initiative, the Foundation continued to advance menstrual equity by empowering participants with knowledge, confidence, and dignity, reinforcing its commitment to women's health and education at the community level.

INITIATIVES

Installation of vending machines in 15 new schools



We, at DYC facilitated the installation of sanitary napkin vending machines in 15 additional schools, except for the ones already covered in previous years, to strengthen access to menstrual hygiene products for adolescent girls.

This initiative aimed to ensure timely and discreet availability of sanitary pads within school premises, supporting uninterrupted education and reducing stigma associated with menstruation. By improving access to essential hygiene facilities, the Foundation contributed to creating safer, more inclusive learning environments for girls.

The intervention reflects Dyvigya Care Wellness Foundation's ongoing commitment to menstrual equity, dignity, and adolescent health. Besides just creating awareness through sessions, we also make sure to try up setting vending machines in as many schools as possible for an easier and equal access to every woman/girl out there.


